The Tigers began to recover in a much more even second period. Game MVP Matt Holte (2+1) scored a power-play marker for Vernon three minutes into the period. Prince George replied two minutes later but the Tigers came roaring back with another power play goal by Holte. Tigers Take Silver in Provincial Championships

performance may have surprised a few people but the teams from the Heartland are now at the top of the heap in BC."

The final game was nearly a carbon copy of the Tiger-Posse match-up in game one of the championships. The Posse scored twice in the opening minutes. However, Mitch Schocter (2+1) scored at the 8-minute mark to get the Tigers into the game. Two more Prince George goals followed, ending the first period 4-1 for the Posse.

The Tigers began to recover in a much more even second period. Game MVP Matt Holte (2+1) scored a power-play marker for Vernon three minutes into the period. Prince George replied two minutes later but the Tigers came roaring back with another power play goal by Holte. The Posse scored again before Karl Friesen (1+0) narrowed the gap at the mid-point of the period.
