Vernon Junior Tigers draw Venom in semifinal

For seven consecutive seasons, from 2012 to 2018, the Vernon Iron Ghost Construction Tigers and Kamloops Venom met in the Thompson Okanagan Junior Lacrosse League championship series, the Venom winning four of them.

Now, the two rivals are meeting to determine a spot in the best-of-five.

The regular-season champion Venom host the Tigers in Game 1 of a best-of-three semifinal Monday (tonight), July 11, at Memorial Arena at 7 p.m. Game 2 is Wednesday, 7 p.m., at Kal Tire Place. A third game, if necessary, would be played Friday, July 15, in Kamloops.

The league hasn't had a playoff champion since 2019, when the loop was down to three teams, and the third squad, the South Okanagan Flames, won the title, beating Kamloops in the championship. The Flames knocked off Vernon 2-1 in the semifinal.

The Flames are taking on the expansion Kelowna Kodiaks, who have home floor advantage, in the other semifinal.

The Venom defeated the hometown Kodiaks 15-6 Saturday, July 9, for their 14th consecutive on-floor win. Kamloops finished on top of the standings with a 13-2-1 record. The B.C. Lacrosse Association overturned a 12-4 Venom victory over the South Okanagan Flames in Oliver June 26, awarding South OK the two points.

A makeup game between the Flames and Kamloops set for Friday, July 8, in Oliver, was not played due to a lack of referees. Each team was awarded one point.

Kamloops was 4-0 against Vernon this season, outscoring the Tigers 56-25 in the season series.

* The league held its first-ever all-star game in Kamloops Sunday, July 10, with each of its five teams represented.

Team White edged Team Black 13-12.

Jacob Brewer of the Tigers was the captain for Team White. He was joined on the squad by teammates Noah Pearson and Nate Williamson, along with goalie Ryley Lockhurst and runners Warin Buzzell, Ethin Campbell and Tegan Evans of the Armstrong Shamrocks. Vernon head coach Casey Sherriff and Armstrong assistant Dave Evans were on the bench for Team White.

Thomas Pain of the Tigers, and Joseph Jankowski, Jayden Gulka and Colton McCauley of Armstrong played for Team Black.

Kael Black and Carston Disher of Vernon were selected to the game, but were unable to attend.

The Kamloops Venom scored six unanswered goals over the game's final 42 minutes 17 seconds to post their 12th straight Thompson Okanagan Junior Lacrosse League victory, a 10-5 decision over the hometown Vernon Iron Ghost Construction Tigers Saturday, June 25, at Kal Tire Place.

Power play markers from Caleb Campbell and Nolan Virgo at 17:43 and 19:36, respectively, capped a wild first period that saw the teams score 11 goals with Kamloops taking a 6-5 lead into the intermission.

Kaden Dempsey and Seamus Bankier, on a powerplay, scored in the second frame to give the Venom an 8-5 lead heading into the third period. Josh Abel and Temeke7 Gottfriedsen, with his third of the game, had markers in the final period.

The Venom built a 3-1 first-period lead on goals from Campbell (first of two), Gottfriedsen and Jax Anderson, only to have the Tigers roar back with three straight goals from Colten Colmorgen and Kael Black on powerplays, and a shorthanded beauty from Thomas Pain which gave Vernon a 4-3 lead at 12:49.

Gottfriedsen tied the game for Kamloops at 14:44 before Vernon affiliate call-up Aidan Wattie scored at

16:29, giving the Tigers their final goal and lead of the night.

Wattie also added two assists.

Damien Glover opened the Vernon scoring at 4:02, which tied the game 1-1.

Robert Gerow made 22 saves over the final two periods for Kamloops and finished the game with 31 stops.

Virgo will be looking at some league discipline after receiving a five-minute match penalty for spearing in the third period.

Derek Pereboom made 51 saves in goal for the Tigers, who finished the regular season at 3-10-3, and without an on-floor victory at home. Their only win at Kal Tire Place was a 1-0 forfeit victory over the South Okanagan Flames in what was to be the team's home opener.

Vernon Tigers stick it to Armstrong Shamrocks

The Vernon Iron Ghost Construction Tigers picked up their biggest win of the Thompson Okanagan Junior Lacrosse League season Thursday, June 23.

And, in the process, clinched a post-season berth and pushed their arch-rivals to the brink of elimination.

The Tigers snapped an 11-game winless streak with an impressive 9-6 win over the hometown Armstrong Shamrocks at the Nor-Val Sports Centre. It was the fourth and final meeting of the season between the two clubs, and the first time there was a winner. The other three games ended in ties.

Vernon (3-9-3) moved into third place in the five-team league, one point ahead of the idle South Okanagan Flames (4-9) and two up on the Shamrocks (2-10-3).

Vernon and Armstrong each have one game remaining with the Tigers holding a tiebreaker over the Shamrocks.

Vernon will host the red-hot Kamloops Venom, winners of 11 straight, Saturday night, June 25, at Kal Tire Place, while Armstrong entertains South Okanagan in a must-win contest for the Shamrocks at Nor-Val the same night. Both games start at 7 p.m.

If Armstrong beats the Flames, they would move into the fourth and final playoff spot, one point ahead of South Okanagan, and would need the Flames to lose their final two games against the Venom in order to make the post-season.

Kamloops can still catch the Kelowna Kodiaks for first place. The Venom (11-1) have four games left while Kelowna (12-3) will close its regular season when they host Kamloops Saturday, July 9.

Vernon jumped out to a 2-0 lead Thursday on a pair of markers from Noah Pearson before the teams combined for three goals in less than six minutes to finish the opening 20 minutes tied 3-3.

The Tigers took control of the game past the midway mark of the second period when Aiden Wattie, Colten Colmorgen and Jacob Brewer scored 1:25 apart to snap the deadlock and give Vernon a 6-3 bulge.

Caden Peters pulled Armstrong to within two with a goal at 15:52 but Kael Black and Isaac Coombs, on a breakaway, scored 65 seconds apart to give the Tigers a four-goal cushion.

That lasted all of 1:18 when Ethin Campbell got a shot through the pads of Vernon goalie Derek Pereboom to make it 8-5 Vernon after 40 minutes.

The teams traded goals in the third - Colmorgen scoring a powerplay marker for the Tigers and Carson Irmen netting a shorthanded marker for the Irish.

Black, on a four-on-three powerplay, had the other Vernon tally.

Joseph Jankowski, Kaleb Davis, shorthanded, and Peters had the other Armstrong goals.

Pereboom finished with 34 saves while Ryley Lockhurst made 47 stops for the Shamrocks.

More than just bragging rights are on the line in Armstrong tonight.

The Vernon Iron Ghost Construction Tigers and Armstrong Shamrocks meet for the fourth and final time during the regular season of the Thompson Okanagan Junior Lacrosse League (7 p.m. start, Nor-Val Sports Centre).

It's a huge game with playoff implications for both teams.

The three previous meetings have ended in ties: 9-9, 11-11, 9-9. The teams are tied for the fourth and final playoff spot with identical records (2-9-3). Both trail the third-place South Okanagan Flames (4-9) by one point. Armstrong and Vernon each have two games left.

The Flames and Shamrocks meet Saturday, June 25, at 7 p.m. at the Nor-Val Sports Centre while the Tigers host the Kamloops Venom (11-1) at 7 p.m. at Kal Tire Place. Kamloops has won 11 in a row. Vernon is winless in its last 11 heading into Thursday's encounter with their arch-rivals Armstrong.

The Venom are trying to catch the Kelowna Kodiaks (12-3) for first place and have three games left as well. Each league team is supposed to play 16 games but a game May 15 between South Okanagan and Kamloops was cancelled due to a lack of qualified referees, and no make-up date has been announced.

Armstrong enters Thursday's matchup having dropped two of its last three. The Shamrocks lost 17-3 to the visiting Venom Thursday, June 16, a make-up game from a contest postponed May 13.

The Shamrocks went to Penticton Saturday, June 18, and beat the Flames 11-9. Caden Peters led Armstrong with three goals and three assists. Teigan Evans had 3+2 while Jorge Hall and Joey Mazzei chipped in 2+2. Ethin Campbell had the other goal and Colton Macaulay made 26 saves.

The next night in Kamloops, the Venom defeated Armstrong 9-4 in a game that was shortened due to a serious injury to an unnamed player. Kaleb Davis, Hall, Campbell and Nathan Davis-Lent scored for Armstrong while Macaulay made 33 saves.

The Tigers were 0-2 on the road on the weekend.

Vernon lost 18-4 Saturday, June 17, in Kelowna. Kael Black, Nate Williamson, Noah Pearson and Jacob Brewer scored for the Tigers, while Derek Pereboom made 48 saves in goal.

The Tigers dropped a 13-4 decision the next night in Penticton. Brewer scored twice for Vernon, Pearson and Bradley Scabar added singles and Pereboom finished with 45 saves.

The Flames failed to put some distance between themselves and the fourth-place teams when they fell 7-6 Wednesday, June 22, to the league-leading Kelowna Kodiaks in Oliver.

The South Okanagan Flames were as hot as the temperature inside Kal Tire Place in Vernon Saturday.

With the arena's air conditioning malfunctioning, and a Vernon Iron Ghost Construction Tigers' season-high attendance of more than 400 fans in the building, the Flames rolled to an impressive 16-7 Thompson Okanagan Junior Lacrosse League victory June 4.

Whenever they face each other in 2022, there's no quit in either the Vernon Iron Ghost Construction Tigers or the Armstrong Shamrocks.

Then again, neither team has developed that knockout blow needed to put the other away.

For the third time in as many Thompson Okanagan Junior Lacrosse League meetings this year, the two bitter rivals played to a draw.

Jorge Hall's goal driving to the net and beating Vernon goalie Derek Pereboom with a low shot at 18:29 of the third period gave Armstrong a 9-9 tie with the Tigers Saturday, May 28, at Kal Tire Place in Vernon.

It was the second consecutive game in Vernon in which the Shamrocks rallied in the third period. Armstrong was down 9-6 with less than 10 minutes to play.

The comeback started in a weird way as Tigers' defender Nate Williamson inadvertently put the ball into his own net, swiping at a bouncing loose ball and knocking it past Pereboom at 10:27. The goal was credited to Armstrong captain Ethin Campbell.

Hall scored a powerplay marker at 12:19 to cut Vernon's lead to one. He then played a key role in the final minute. Hall's shot attempt was blocked and stolen by Tigers' captain Jacob Brewer, who raced to the other end while being hounded by Hall. Brewer got a shot away but it was stopped by Shamrocks goalie Ryley Lockhurst.

The turning point in the contest for Vernon came at the 11:53 mark of the second period.

Trailing 4-3, Armstrong's Nathan Davis-Lent took two, five-minute slashing penalties on the same play and was given a game misconduct.
